PE Grant Action Plan Statement 2017/18

At Grangewood School we strive to be a healthy school and PE plays an important role in achieving this. We aim to establish an active culture which encourages all children to participate and enjoy exciting and challenging activities, meeting the needs of children with a diverse range of physical abilities and needs.

This action plan has been designed to enhance high quality Sport and physical activity provision which covers the breath of our Scheme of Work, whilst also providing opportunities to access places that provide different sporting experiences and equipment in the wider community that are normally unavailable.

Increased participation in PE promotes the undertaking of exercise that can be continued in to adulthood to encourage and promote a healthy lifestyle.

The £16,830 funding provided by the PE Grant will contribute to delivering high quality provision, enhanced by extra curriculum opportunities intending to make striking impact on outcomes for pupils.
